

Aim








How are relevant stakeholders identified?

A multi-actor approach is implemented within the framework of the Stakeholder Engagement Hub.








Stakeholder engagement timeline

How does EUFOR E contribute to the EU agenda?

EU Forest Strategy 2030 aims to:


- Support the socio-economic functions of forests for thriving rural areas and boost forest-based bioeconomy within sustainability boundaries.
- Protect, restore and enlarge the EU's forests to combat climate change, reverse biodiversity loss and ensure resilient and multifunctional forest ecosystems.



Regional Workshops: 1st Round



- Between 06-09/2023
- 6 parallel co-creation workshops following <u>the same methodology</u>
- to kick-off SRIA development: focus SCOPE and Initial collection of R&I topics
- To involve all EU countries (according to regional distribution) + associated countries
- Representatives of the <u>entire</u> quadruple helix for each country
- Approx. 40 participants per workshop
- 1 day workshop
- 4 main topics



Regional Workshops: 1st Round



• 183 participants from 30 countries (EU and non-EU)

• Northern Europe: 49

• West-Central: 22

Mediterranean: 18

Western Atlantic: 37

• South Eastern: 29

• Central: 28

from all four stakeholder branches

• research: 74

• government: 42

• business: 24

• civil society: 14

Stakeholder composition



- 345 stakeholders identified as potential TWG members
- 113 stakeholders have indicated their interest in participating in the TWGs
- 65 stakeholders participated in the TWG Kick-Off Meeting at 14 November

Next steps in 2024



• until middle of April: stakeholder consultations within the single TWGs

• beginning of May: finalising first SRIA draft

middle of May: presentation of SRIA draft to all interested stakeholders

middle of May: presentation of SRIA draft and Partnership draft proposal to EU Commission

• end of May: EU Commission to send out request to the member states in order to commit themselves to the Partnership

• late summer: 2nd round of regional stakeholder workshops

September: commitment of members states expected

November: 2nd round of European stakeholder workshop

European Partnership on Forestry






EUFORE's work creates a solid collaborative basis for a European Partnership on Forests and Forestry.
