The geographic context

- Membership is open to all Members of FAO
 - Member Countries of the European Forestry Commission (EFC), the Near East Forestry Commission (NEFC) and the African Forestry and Wildlife Commission (AFWC)
 - whose territories are situated wholly or partially in the Mediterranean basin
 - to meet, share experiences and establish cooperative programmes
- Membership is also open to those with forest, agricultural or grazing economies that are intimately associated with those of the Mediterranean region
- 27 Members, including 26 states and one organization



The mission

- periodically review trends in the use of forest land in the Mediterranean area and assess the impact of changes implemented in the agricultural, industrial and urban sectors;
- advise Member Governments accordingly on the reorientation or improvements necessary to meet evolving situations or newly emerging needs
- determine and carry out technical studies and surveys to assist in the formulation and implementation of national forest policies in collaboration with Member States and with the support of the appropriate national forestry agencies
- identify forestry research priorities in the Mediterranean area, determine forestry research projects of common interest to Member Governments in the region and recommend measures necessary for forestry research institutes in the region to carry out these projects




THE MEDITERRANEAN FLAGSHIP

- learning, replicability, and scalability potential
- global and regional outreach potential


The Targeted Support




- Showcasing all effective post-fire restoration practices being used in the region that could be replicated in different areas and will set the basis for regional collaboration
- Knowledge sharing and learning opportunity for all stakeholders dealing with wildfire management in the region
- Increase the political will to seek a joint regional effort to restore more resilient landscapes prone to wildfire risk, thus contributing to the implementation of the regional flagship

The Paris agreement in action

- IKI-funded project 2018-2024
- Mediterranean regional component + 2 national components in Morocco and Lebanon
 - Letter of Agreement with Associazione Foresta Modello delle Montagne Fiorentine
 - Objectives:
 - Implement restoration activities on the ground in Ifrane (Morocco) in collaboration with Ifrane Model Forest and Arebica association
 - 2. Organize exchange visits on restoration between 2 Mediterranean countries (Italy and Morocco)



Activities with MMFN

- 1. Implement restoration activities on the ground in Ifrane (Morocco) in collaboration with Ifrane Model Forest and Arebica
 - 50 ha under restoration in the Ifran Model Forest
 - 25 ha under restoration in the Aghbalou Larbi forest (Arebica)

• Activities will include capacity-building, dissemination and involvement of local population and

communities

- 2. Organize exchange visits on restoration between 2 Mediterranean countries (Italy and Morocco)
 - Experts from Morocco and Italy will visit each-other sites and learn more/discuss about restoration options and management of forest resources, with a participatory approach
